CLAREIRA

Clareira (in Tupi, *Baependi*) is an area of grass vegetation, or of the undergrowth vegetation located inside of a forest or a woodland. Its formation is vital for the renewal of the forest and for its diversity, as it functions as a kind of granary: There, new species can emerge, and the existing ones guarantee their survival and germination. In the case of the Amazon rainforest, for example, these are the areas in which nomadic indigenous groups establish temporary settlements.
